AA Kuhl (1873-19??)

Mr. A. A. Kuhl was born on a farm near Ohio City, Ohio, in 1873. His ancestors are reflected in his well-balanced, straightforward countenance. His country rearing gave him a hardy constitution, which now sustains him in his unrelenting work.

He graduated in due time from the Western Ohio Normal School, and then taught two years in his alma mater. Later he attended Michael's Pen Art Hall at Delaware, Ohio. He then taught itinerantly, and in '93 taught in the Muncie, Ind., Business College.

In 1894 he first attended the Zanerian, returning two or three times since. Ten years ago he went South and taught for three years in the Jasper, Fla., Normal Institute. In 1898, in connection with Mr. W. A. Little, he founded the Georgia Normal College and Business Institute, Abbeville, Ga. With ability and pluck as a beginning, the school has grown from one to four modern school properties, with an annual enrollment of upwards of seven hundred pupils.

The school is today recognized as one of the leading educational institutions of the South.

Mr. Kuhl is one of the "coolest," sanest, truest, most modest, and capable among the many whom we claim as our friends. He is happily married, lives modestly, never forgets a favor, is deliberate but sure, and uncompromisingly honest, moral, and truthful. Would that there were more as good, as unassuming, as thorough, as sincere and as efficient.
